Hogwash from Rolling Hills Country

The new Rolling Hills Snowmobile & ATV Washburn County trail maps are enroute to the printer as we speak! Look for distribution of your '23-'24 trail map in November. There are some trail extensions, revisions AND a host of new and repeat advertisers on the NEW map.
